Time and Entanglement: The Study of Time XIX

All papers accepted for presentation at the International Society for the Study of Time conference “Time and Entanglement” are eligible to be considered for publication in a volume comprising refereed essays. Posters, talks, or alternative format presentations are eligible for submission in essay form, as are those papers accepted but later retracted. We are particularly interested in papers that directly address the conference theme. The volume will be published by Brill Academic Publishers, and it will represent the nineteenth in “The Study of Time” series, which was inaugurated in 1972 by founder J. T. Fraser. Submissions will be evaluated in a double-blind process: an anonymized version will be sent for evaluation by referees after the essay has been stripped of identifiers of authorship. Please note that presentation at the conference does not guarantee publication in the volume.

In addition to the conference volume a special issue of the ISST journal, *KronoScope* will be dedicated to the conference. The journal issue will have an earlier publication date (the issue will be 2027/2 while we anticipate the publication date of the volume as December, 2028). Papers should be submitted **either** to the conference volume **or** to *KronoScope* (see accompanying CFP). Submission guidelines

- Please submit your essay electronically (as a Word document, double-spaced) by email to Stephanie Nelson, nelson@bu.edu by **December 1, 2026**.
- Essays should be between 5000-8000 words. References and bibliography should be formatted according to *The Chicago Manual of Style* (18th edition). Either the Notes and Bibliography or Author-Date References style of documentation is acceptable.
- Essays should be geared toward an interdisciplinary audience rather than specialists in your particular field.
- Please include a list of **three suggested referees** who did not attend the conference and who can offer a fair evaluation. We may or may not draw upon these referees.
- If your paper is accepted for publication in the volume, we will ask you to supply a list of possible index terms. It will be your responsibility to check the copy-edited version and proofs and to provide us with any suggestions for revision in a timely manner.
- If you will require permissions in order to reproduce copyrighted material, please begin work on getting them as soon as possible as this process can take a long time.
